I had been searching for a few years for some understanding of the etiology and manifestation of this disease. Several years prior, my wife Donna had died from the effects of severe preeclampsia and HELLP Syndrome, several weeks after delivering our (perfectly healthy) twin boys. Shortly following the summer Seattle gathering, I joined the Board of Directors, and have been involved with the Foundation, in various capacities, ever since.

It is really my delight and pleasure to be working with such dedicated people, and I very much look forward to building on the successes and momentum of the past several years, and take the role of Board Chair quite seriously. We have a unique opportunity, a position in the realm of non-profits focused on the health and awareness of expectant mothers and their families at large, that remains so necessary and vital."
